

★ 次の英文は、中学3年生のサキ(Saki)が、津軽三味線(Tsugaru-jamisen)について英語の 授業で発表した内容の一部です。これを読んで、あとの(1)~(3)に答えなさい。(21 点)

Last week, a musician came to our school and we saw a *Tsugaru-jamisen* performance. I was surprised to hear its very beautiful and \*powerful sound. I told this experience to my grandmother because she loved the *Tsugaru-jamisen*. She said, "When I saw one musician's performance for the first time, I felt that his music was wonderful. His name is \*Takahashi Chikuzan. He has been my favorite." After talking with my grandmother, I became interested in him. I'll tell you the story about his life that I heard from her.

Chikuzan was born in Aomori \*Prefecture in 1910. When he was little, he lost almost all of his \*sight. After that, there were many hard things in his life. But he learned how to play the *Tsugaru-jamisen* and listened to many players' sounds again and again. He practiced a lot to play the *Tsugaru-jamisen* better. By doing so, he developed his original way of playing it. Later, he started to play with a famous singer in many places in Japan. He also visited some other countries and showed his performance. People felt that it was very exciting. He died in 1998, but his music was given to the next generation.

I watched Chikuzan's videos on the Internet after hearing about him. His \*soulful music moved my heart. I felt his life and strong \*spirit. I thought that the *Tsugaru-jamisen* became famous because his music was loved by many people. <u>Takahashi Chikuzan became one of the people I respect.</u>

"Mika, how about joining the next \*election to be the \*president of the student council? You can communicate well with our classmates, and you always take care of your friends. I think you will be a good \*leader." When my classmate Junko told this to me, I felt happy because I liked doing things for other students. But I was not good at talking in front of many people. I had no \*confidence because I was only a leader in a small group. So, I couldn't decide to join the election then.

One day, I watched the news about a \*project on TV. It said, "There are many buildings which are not used in Japan now. A company started to use one of them as a hotel. The rooms of the hotel were designed by four students who went to a \*technical school. One of them became the leader of the project." I got interested in the news because it let me know how the students worked and how the leader felt in the project. The students had many ideas for designing rooms, but they found some problems. They needed to think about what they could do or couldn't do with the money for the project, and they sometimes had to make some \*decorations by themselves. But they talked a lot to find the best way. They always helped each other and worked together. It took a long time to finish designing the rooms. I thought the rooms were unique and nice.

At the end of the news, the leader of the project talked about what he felt. "At first, I couldn't imagine that I could do well because I had no experience as a leader in a big project like this. Also, I got nervous easily and was not very good at communicating. But I wanted to make good rooms with the other members in the project, so I tried to change myself and communicated a lot with them. Working as a leader was not easy for me, but I could learn a lot through this experience."

I felt that the leader's words were saying to me, "You should go forward even if you have something that you are not good at. You can change yourself and that will make you proud."
